

LIST OF AUTHORIZED IDENTIFICATION

OPTION 1: GOVERNMENT-ISSUED IDENTIFICATION (ONE PIECE REQUIRED)

An elector may vote after producing one piece of identification issued by the Government of Yukon, a Yukon First Nation*, the Government of Canada, or a municipality. The identification must show the elector's name and address of residence or mailing address.

If no residential address is included in the identification, a Declaration of the address of Residence is required.

- Fishing License
- General Identification Card
- Health Care Insurance Plan Card
- Any other identification card issued by a Canadian government (Federal, Territorial, First Nation, or local), with name and current address of residence or mailing address
- Hunting License
- Operator's (Driver's) License
- Trapping License
- Vehicle Registration

*Yukon First Nation as defined in the *Cooperation in Governance Act*

OPTION 2: AUTHORIZED IDENTIFICATION (TWO PIECES REQUIRED, ONE WITH A CURRENT PHYSICAL ADDRESS OF RESIDENCE OR MAILING ADDRESS)

An elector may register to vote after producing two pieces of identification. Both pieces must show the elector's name and one must show the elector's current residential or mailing address.

If no address of residence is included in the identification, a Declaration of the address of residence is required.

This list may not be exhaustive; and may be amended as authorized by the Chief Electoral Officer.

OPTION 3: ATTESTATIONS

Attestations can be used to establish identity and residential addresses for electors who may be unable to provide other types of identification.

A Declaration of Address of Residence will be required from the incarcerated elector if no other identification is provided

OPTION 3A: IDENTITY AND ORDINARY RESIDENCE FOR ELECTORS WHO MAY BE UNABLE TO PROVIDE OTHER TYPES OF IDENTIFICATION:

- Care Centre Electors (issued by an authorized representative of a care center)
- Electors Without a Fixed Address (issued by an authorized representative of a facility that provides accommodations, meals, or other services to the elector)
- Hospitalized Electors (issued by an authorized representative of a hospital)
- Tenant Electors (issued by an authorized representative of a property manager or owner) – identification is required

OPTION 3B: IDENTITY AND ORDINARY RESIDENCE FOR INCARCERATED ELECTORS WHO MAY BE UNABLE TO PROVIDE OTHER TYPES OF IDENTIFICATION:

- Incarcerated Electors (issued by an authorized representative of a correctional institution)
- The ordinary residence of an incarcerated elector is the first of places from a list of places authorized for that purpose by the Chief Electoral Officer for which the incarcerated elector knows the address
- The address of the correctional facility cannot be used to establish residence.

OPTION 4: VOUCHING

An elector who is unable to provide authorized identification may vote at a polling station during Advance and Polling Day polls by appointing a vouching elector whose name appears on the List of Electors for their electoral district. A vouching elector is restricted to vouching for one elector.

DECLARATION OF ALTERNATE PROOF OF RESIDENTIAL ADDRESS

An elector who proves identity and establishes the elector's name by providing identification authorized under Option 1, Option 2, and Option 3A may prove the elector's place of residence by making a declaration in writing in a form approved by the Chief Electoral Officer.
